4. Ease of use— Pages wins!


Table tools— Word can do calculations, but they aren't live and there's no "fill right" so you have to insert the formula over and over. Word doesn't align text the way you'd expect. style.

Page can do calculations and they *are* live and there is a "fill right" so you only have to enter the formula in one cell. Alignment is exactly as you'd expect: text is left aligned, numbers are right aligned. Conditional formatting automatically highlights cells according to your rules.

Adding images— yes, you can insert images into a Word document... but if you want to manipulate the picture (knock out the background, change the text wrapping options, resize the image) it's clumsy as anything. Plus the menus change all the time, and the icons are lousy. Compare to Pages, where everything is easy and clean, and it works the way you'd guess it would. Even where both apps have the same feature (background removal), Pages' implantation works perfectly, and Word's doesn't.
